

## Highlights of 23 & 24 May 2026 Current Affairs

- Sardar Kartar Singh Sarabha, the Indian revolutionary, was born on 24 May 1896 in Sarabha village near Ludhiana. He was the most famous accused in the Lahore Conspiracy Trial and was executed at Lahore on 16 November 1915. His father, Mangal Singh, died when Kartar Singh was very young, and after his father's death, his upbringing was taken care of by his grandfather, Sardar Badan Singh Ji.
- The Hemkund Sahib Yatra begins with the first jatha from Gurdwara Govindghat near Badrinath, as the portals for registration have also opened in Chamoli, Uttarakhand.
- Sahi Ram Bishnoi, the oldest legislator of undivided Punjab, passed away at the age of 101 in Sakta Khera, Dabwali.
- Tulsi Gabbard resigned from the position of U.S. National Intelligence Director, citing her husband's diagnosis of bone cancer.
- India has successfully test-fired the short-range ballistic missile Agni-1 from the test range at Chandipur in Odisha.
- Yuki Bhambri of India and his New Zealand partner Michael Venus finished as runners-up at the Geneva Open after losing in the ATP 250 doubles final.
- Auckland FC defeated Sydney 1-0 in the Grand Final and became the first New Zealand team to clinch an A-League championship.
- North Korea's Naegohyang won the Asian Women's Championship by defeating Tokyo Verdy Belezza of Japan 1-0. With this victory, Naegohyang has also qualified for next year's FIFA Women's Championship Cup.
- Bruno Fernandes, a midfielder for Manchester United, was named the Premier League Player of the Season after his team finished third in the tournament.
- Gurindervir Singh broke the national record in the 100-metre race with a timing of 10.09 seconds at the National Senior Federation Competition, surpassing the previous record held by Animesh Kujur.
- Vishal T.K. became the first Indian to run the men's 400-metre race in under 45 seconds, achieving a timing of 44.98 seconds.
- Indian Army Major Abhilasha Barak will receive the UN Gender Advocate Award for her deployment in a West Asian nation and her efforts in working with women.
