

Highlights of 27 May 2026 Current Affairs

- A three-day Tibetan Cultural Festival will be held in Dharamsala by the Central Tibetan Administration from May 28 to 30 to showcase cultural heritage and traditions.
- The Government of India will sell up to a 2% stake in Coal India, valued at about ₹5,000 crore, through an Offer for Sale (OFS).
- India has achieved another milestone in the telecom sector, with total subscribers growing to 133.7 crore in April, according to the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI). Bharti Airtel emerged as the leader with the highest number of subscribers, followed by Reliance Jio in second place.
- Taiwan has become the world's fifth-largest stock market after surpassing India, which slipped to sixth place. The sudden surge in Taiwan's market was driven by the Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC), the world's largest chipmaker, attracting global investors to the island nation. Taiwan's market valuation now stands at \$4.95 trillion, compared to India's \$4.92 trillion. Taiwan ranks behind the United States, mainland China, Japan, and Hong Kong.
- Suryakumar Yadav, India's T20 World Cup-winning captain, is likely to play against the Uganda cricket team for Triumph Knights Mumbai. The Uganda team is touring India and, in Mumbai, they will play four one-day matches along with several T20 games.
- Grandmaster Iniyam Panneerselvam won double gold by clinching both the rapid and blitz titles at the Commonwealth Chess Championship in Sri Lanka.
- The Government of India has launched the Semiconductor Investors' Support Portal to boost chip manufacturing under the India Semiconductor Mission (ISM). The portal will function under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY). Through this Investors' Support Portal, MeitY has created a dedicated online platform to address grievances and support investors' interests in the semiconductor industry.
- India shone at the U23 Asian Wrestling Championship as freestyle wrestlers won four more medals. Mohit Kumar (65 kg) and Chandermohan (79 kg) clinched gold medals, while Deepak secured silver in the 61 kg category. Another Deepak added to the tally with a bronze in the 74 kg category.
- Adani Green Energy Limited (AGEL) has commissioned a 3.37 gigawatt-hour (GWh) battery energy storage system at Khavda in Gujarat. This is the world's largest single-location battery storage deployment outside China.
- India will host the global campaign for the first World Yogasana Championship 2026, entirely dedicated to Yogasana, in Ahmedabad, Gujarat.
- Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Shivraj Singh Chouhan released the book *Apnapan: Narendra Modi Sang Mere Anubhav* in New Delhi.
- Scientists at the Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR), Bengaluru, have developed CLEAR technology (Cleavable Light-Erased Antibody Reporter), which will enhance disease diagnosis. This advanced imaging platform is expected to improve the detection of conditions such as cancer, neurological disorders, and immune-related diseases.
