

Highlights of 28 May 2026 Current Affairs

- The Government of Assam has cleared the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) Bill, which will establish a legal framework for marriages, live-in relationships, and related matters. The UCC is mentioned in the Constitution of India under Part IV, Directive Principles of State Policy, Article 44. Recently, Uttarakhand became the first state in the country to implement the UCC.
- Raja Randhir Singh, Asian Games gold-medalist shooter and the longest-serving Secretary General of the Indian Olympic Association (1987–2012), who also belonged to the family of the Maharaja of Patiala and was the cousin of former Punjab Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh, has died at the age of 79.
- Shankar Lal Dhopra has been appointed as the Chairperson of the Haryana School Education Board (BSEH).
- Penpa Tsering took the oath as the Sikyong (President) of the Tibetan government-in-exile at the Tsuglagkhang Temple in McLeodganj, in the presence of the 14th Dalai Lama.
- The Government of India has notified a new high-speed corridor between Delhi and Katra, which will pass through Haryana and Punjab. The NE-5 Expressway will serve as the high-speed Delhi–Katra corridor, connecting the capital city Delhi to Katra in Jammu and Kashmir.
- The Union Cabinet has approved the ₹25,000-crore Sarthak Public Distribution System scheme to modernize India's food security network, which currently supports nearly 80 crore beneficiaries. The announcement was made by Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw.
- NASA has unveiled a three-phase plan for establishing a permanent moon base, announced by Administrator Jared Isaacman, with an estimated budget of \$20 billion.
- India won the freestyle team championship at the U23 Asian Wrestling Championships, securing a total of 27 medals — 11 gold, 7 silver, and 9 bronze.
- Esha Singh, a three-time World Championship medalist, won gold in the Munich World Cup finals, setting a new world record.
- Indian para-athlete Sumit Antil broke his own world record in the men's javelin throw F64 category at the Indian Open International Para Athletics Championship.
- India has secured the rights to host the Asian Relay Championships in Chandigarh and the Asian Indoor Championships in Bhubaneswar. The 2027 Asian Relay Championships will be held at the Sector-7 Sports Complex in Chandigarh, while Bhubaneswar will host the Asian Indoor Championships in 2028.
- The Government of India has increased expenditure on primary healthcare from ₹0.5 lakh crore in 2013–14 to ₹1.4 lakh crore in 2022–23, according to the latest National Health Accounts (NHA).
- Vaibhav Sooryavanshi, a 15-year-old, smashed Chris Gayle's record in the IPL by hitting 65 sixes in a single edition, surpassing Gayle's 59 sixes in the 2012 season. Along with this, he also broke Rishabh Pant's record by scoring 600 runs in a single season, becoming the youngest player in IPL history to achieve the feat.
