

Highlights of 25 June 2026 Current Affairs

- New Delhi hosted the 16th meeting of BRICS National Security Advisers (NSA) under India's chairmanship, where Indian NSA Ajit Doval and Chinese NSA Wang Yi met and pledged closer coordination among member countries.
- The Government of Maharashtra has proposed replacing the Takht Sachkhand Sri Hazur Sahib Act with a new legal framework. This new Act will substitute the 70-year-old Nanded Sikh Gurdwara Sachkhand Sri Hazur Abchalnagar Sahib Act, 1959, with the Takht Sachkhand Sri Hazur Abchalnagar Sahib Gurdwara Act, thereby resetting the legal regime governing the Takht in Nanded.
- The Government of Punjab has announced that the state will set up four Artificial Intelligence (AI) universities to cater to the need and growth of Artificial Intelligence worldwide.
- The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Ropar has been awarded Army projects worth ₹120 crore by the Army Technology Board (ATB) for the development of autonomous armoured vehicles and directed energy weapons for the Army.
- The Chief Justice of India is on a visit to Russia, where he signed an MoU with the Russian Supreme Court in Moscow.
- Union Minister of Home and Cooperation Amit Shah has launched the ₹1,500-crore Shri Ambabai (Mahalaxmi) Temple development project in Kolhapur, Maharashtra. The Ambabai (Mahalaxmi) Temple is one of India's revered Shakti Peethas, and with this development project, the temple complex will be transformed into a world-class pilgrimage destination.
- The Government of West Bengal has introduced administrative reforms with the creation of five new districts. The proposal includes Kolkata, Basirhat, Sundarban, Jangipur, and Arambagh, which will become separate districts in the state.
- Alan Greenspan, the former Chairman of the U.S. Federal Reserve, has passed away at the age of 100. He was also known as "The Maestro."
- Lionel Messi's tallest statue in the world has been unveiled in Argentina's capital.
- Union Minister of Home Affairs and Cooperation Amit Shah has launched NAFED's digital auction portal for farmers in India. The portal, NAFEX.IN, enables digital auctions of agricultural commodities, making the process more transparent.
- India became the world's largest ship-recycling nation in 2025, achieving a major milestone in the maritime sector and fulfilling a key target of the Maritime India Vision (MIV) 2030 five years ahead of schedule.
- One of the first drugs for Type 1 Diabetes, which delays its symptoms, has now been approved by the National Health Service (NHS) in England and Wales and is available on the NHS. Type 1 Diabetes is an autoimmune condition in which the body's immune system mistakenly attacks the insulin-producing beta cells in the pancreas.
